## **School Overview**

The Happy Explorers School was formed when the Cincinnati Nature Center disbanded its K-2 program and all enrolled families wanted to continue with a nature-based curriculum and collaborative environment. With our Head Teacher retiring at the end of the 2025-26 school year, we are seeking a teacher to work with her in the coming year and ideally take over as Head Teacher in 2026-27. The candidate will have the opportunity to build on existing curriculum in core subjects (reading, writing, mathematics, science & nature, social studies, history) and develop and/or shift to a more rigorous curriculum as she sees fit. Our teachers have significant support from parents given the unique setup of our school but maintain autonomy in the curriculum and the classroom.

## Job Overview

We are seeking a passionate, dedicated, and self-directed classroom teacher to join our team, working with students in 1st through 4th grades. This part-time position will be based in an outdoor-focused classroom environment that emphasizes hands-on, experiential learning and fosters a deep connection with nature. The ideal candidate will have a Montessori background or similar experience in child-centered, inquiry-based education. The role requires a strong commitment to cultivating a joyful and engaging learning environment for young learners, while also fostering curiosity, independence, and creativity.

## Responsibilities

- Classroom instruction
  - Lead nature-based lessons that integrate academic subjects with hands-on learning
  - Develop age-appropriate and engaging curricula for 1st-4th-grade students that encourage curiosity, critical thinking, and problem-solving and incorporate students' individual interests where feasible
  - Integrate Montessori principles or similar methods to create a learner-driven, self-paced classroom atmosphere
  - Foster collaboration and working relationships among students
